Based on the findings, models will be proposed for effective engagement of the private sector in collaborating with the national government for delivering and demonstrating accountability for quality of care for MNH.

Knowledge Transfer: Learning from a project perspective

- A significant proportion of MNH care is delivered in the Private Sector
- Private Sector want to engage in improving care for Mother and Newborns. The will is there...
- Quality of Care is integral to MNH care not an additional component
- Early engagement and motivation is required
- Having a clear road map which can be visualized is important
- The opportunities are endless, which needs to be capitalized
